Salaam Refugee Services of Survival - Income \$19,000 - Expenses \$16,000

Language interpretation and guidance through the system, 24-7 Safety Net Project

Grants - Eccles Foundation \$8,000, Salt Lake County \$5,000, LDS Church \$6,000.

Project Outcome: 312 Assignments performed for 104 unique clients by two Somali and one Arabic language and culturally adept Social Service Facilitators.

Functional English & Acculturation Training - Eccles Foundation Grant \$2,000 Income = Expenses
15 students per year move from a level where they are unable to communicate in English to a level where they are able to communicate with difficulty to a level where become self-sufficient.
